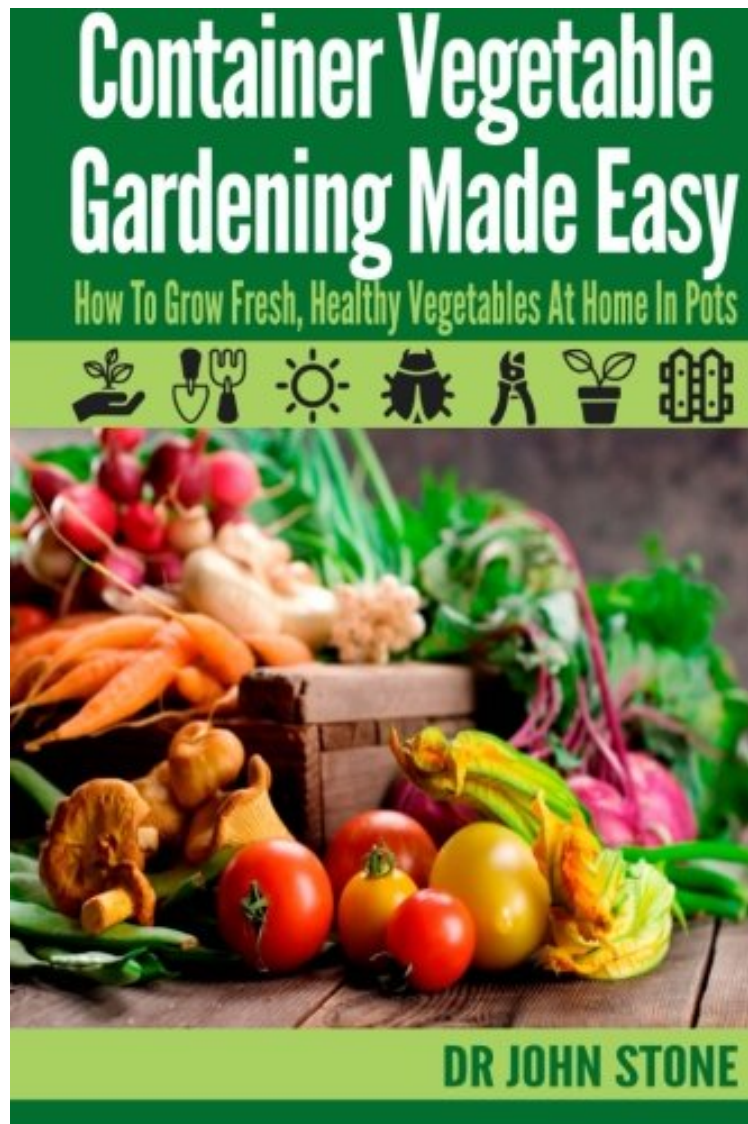

It gives you an idea of what good soil should consist of instead of the author saying "Go buy a bag of X brand and use that." The vegetables suggested tells you certain strains the author has had good results with, and includes how deep to plant, what size pot, and how many inches apart to thin the sprouts for optimum growth potential.
