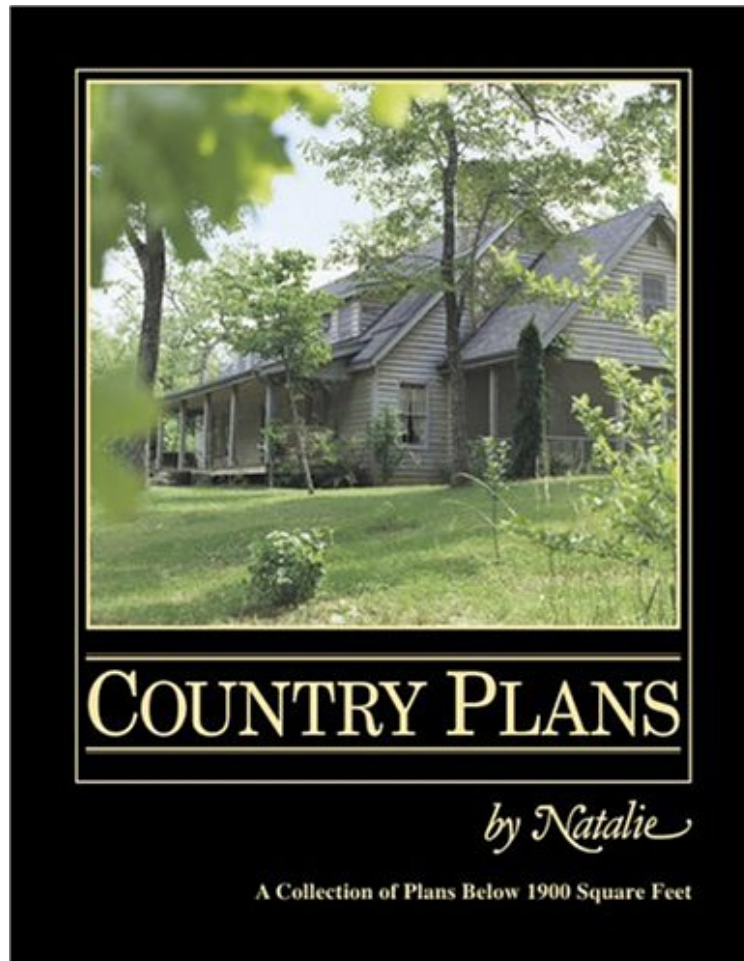

Natalie Howard is currently designing a home for us. She is unlike any other designer I have talked to. She thinks of all the little details like "where will I set my quart of milk when I take it from the fridge to pour it into a glass". She told me this herself on the telephone. She also thinks long and hard about things such as what your guests will see when first entering the home. If you're nearing retirement age, Natalie will remind you of important details like the amount of

space you need to enter the shower from a wheelchair, in case you need that some day. She is just a gem! If you love country and primitive home plans and want to live in a home that is country to it's core, then this book is for you!

'A Collection of House Plans below 1900 square feet' that offers functional floor plans designed to emphasize maximum use of space without loss of aesthetics. These southeastern styled country homes incorporate parlors, porches, fireplaces and dormer windows with the 'old home-place' facade. The square footages of these house plans range from 320 square feet to 1880 square feet.

From the Author These homes are designed for minimum square footage and for growing and shrinking families. For those who need larger homes, many of the main rooms can be increased by a local builder. For example, add two (2) feet to the width of rooms on each side of the stairway, increasing the house length by four (4) feet. Keep in mind; do not to go beyond sixteen (16) feet, longer than 16-foot lumber lengths would require trusses, steel or other structural supports. Brick can replace the wood siding on houses for a more traditional appearance. A quick glance shows most floor plans include front porches, and in many cases there are additional screened porches. Even in arid locales, these porches can be used for extended living areas during spring and fall seasons. A few plans show wood stoves, circulating fireplaces and greenhouses for collecting solar heat. Special designed spaces are planned for sewing, sitting areas, mud rooms, mini-offices, study lofts, utility bathrooms and study alcoves. About the Author Natalie Howard has designed many homes since 1958. Although her degree from Agnes Scott College is in chemistry, she chose to study architecture while her children were still young. In 1966 the Howard family moved to the beautiful North Georgia Mountains where they continue to design functional, yet pretty, country homes. This 2004 edition is an updated publication of her previous 1983 and 1993 editions of Country Plans by Natalie.
