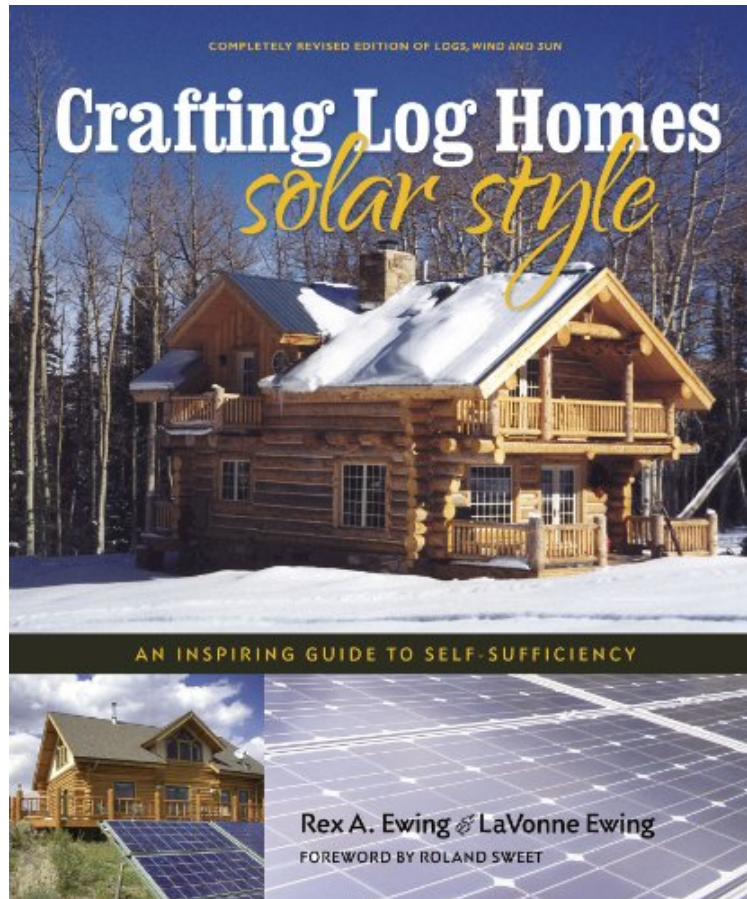

Their three-year project started in 1999 when they left the plains of northern Colorado and moved into a primitive mountain cabin, where they lived with few amenities while handcrafting their new log home. Once completed, they set out to produce a book that would tell others just how attainable their dreams of off-the-grid, log home living could be. Logs, Wind and Sun was released in 2003, and in this updated version, they have included several profiles of other off-grid log home owners who have successfully pursued their dreams. Rex mastered his log building skills in the 1980s when he built two log homes.
