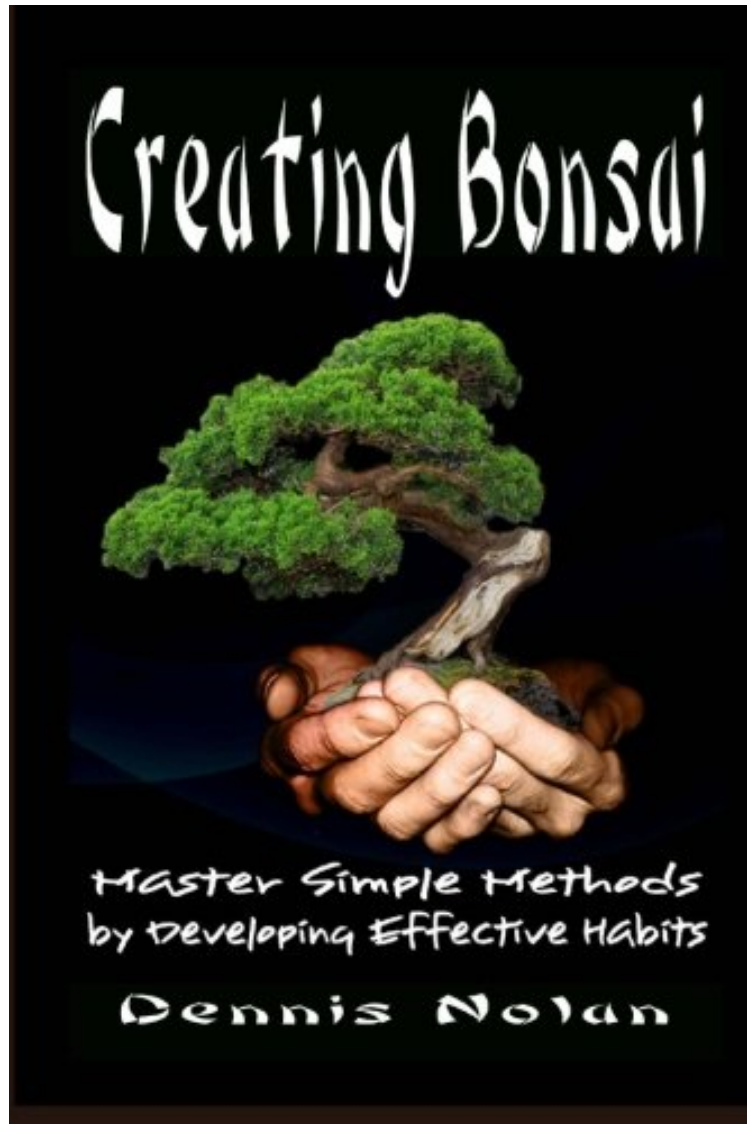

A person could be successful in creating good bonsai, without being distracted and confused by too much information, with just this book. I have made this mistake four times in my bonsai career. To spend two years on application of the principles of this book would not be wasted even if you killed every tree. I would have given this five stars except I found the pet comparison overstated.
