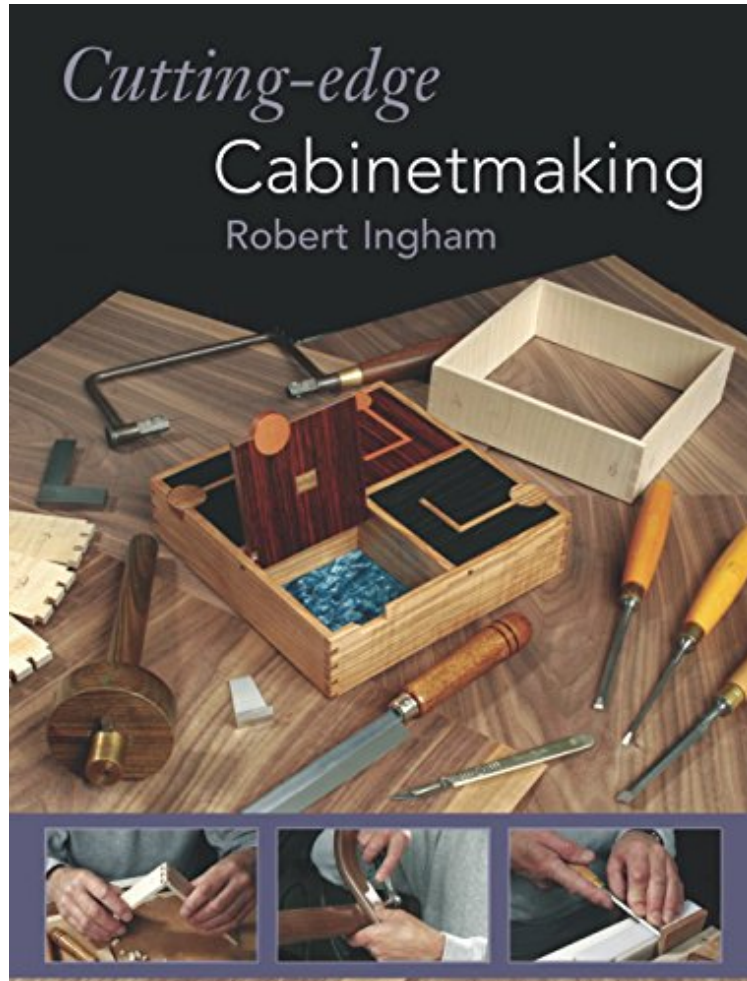

It covers almost everything you need to know from a skills perspective interspersed throughout the book to build cabinets, but not organized with cabinet making in mind.
