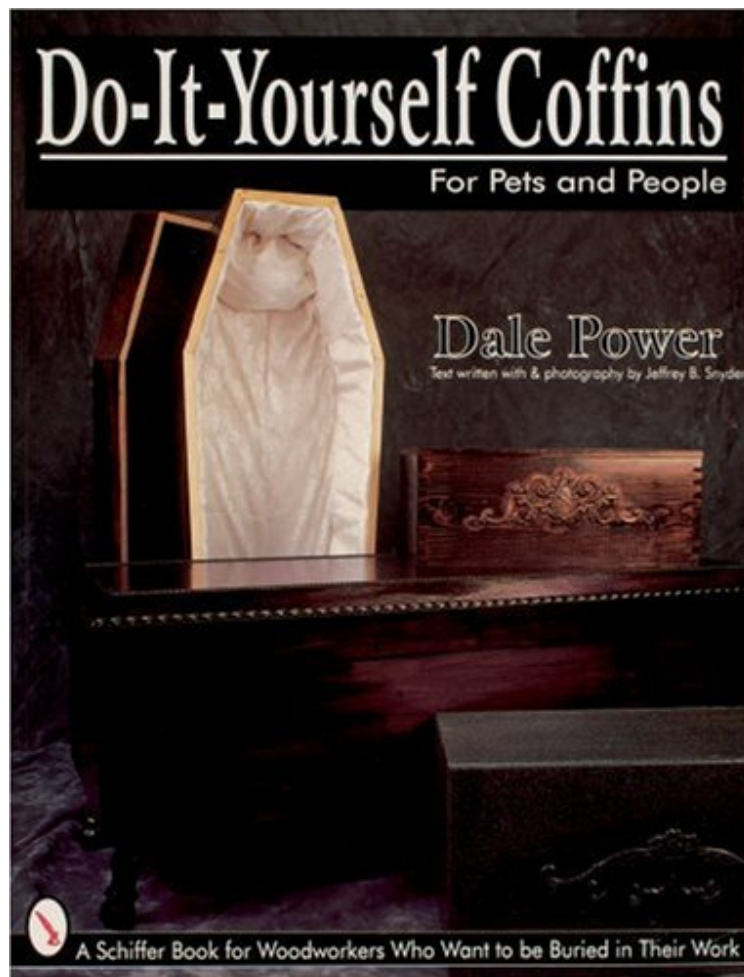

Virtually all the examples and instructions are using stained pine plywood for the coffins. Sorry, but that is not my idea of a good wooden box for burial. One wouldn't want to use salt treated plywood (which is virtually impossible to finish), and any other plywood degrades promptly in wet conditions. This was not implied or stated in the description. This book is a total waste of time and money. the title says "coffins" but it only offers one coffin to build (badly). For an alleged technical manual there are many, many things in the book that are just **WRONG**. The author invites you to rip a piece of plywood that is longer than the standard plywood length. The craftsmanship is horrendous with proudly displayed mitered joints that don't meet. I have the feeling that the guy who gave this book 5 stars is either related to the author or I can picture him trying to turn on his table saw through his straight jacket. Save your money this one is the pits and a disgrace to be sold alongside serious woodworking books

Dale Power departs from his usual animal carvings, burying himself in a new art form--the manufacture of special boxes for pets and people. Here's one project you won't want to put off till tomorrow. All of the tools and techniques needed to produce strong and beautiful coffins are presented here in clear, concise language. Color photographs illustrate every step in the construction of three pet-size and three human-size coffins. Detailed patterns are provided and different box construction techniques are revealed. One box design even doubles as a beautiful blanket chest or coffee table. Once the coffins are built, the discussion turns to the many moldings, appliques, linings, and finishes which may be used to make each coffin unique. A color gallery is also provided. With full color illustrations and detailed instructions, this book is a challenge to the novice and a joy for the experienced craftsman.
