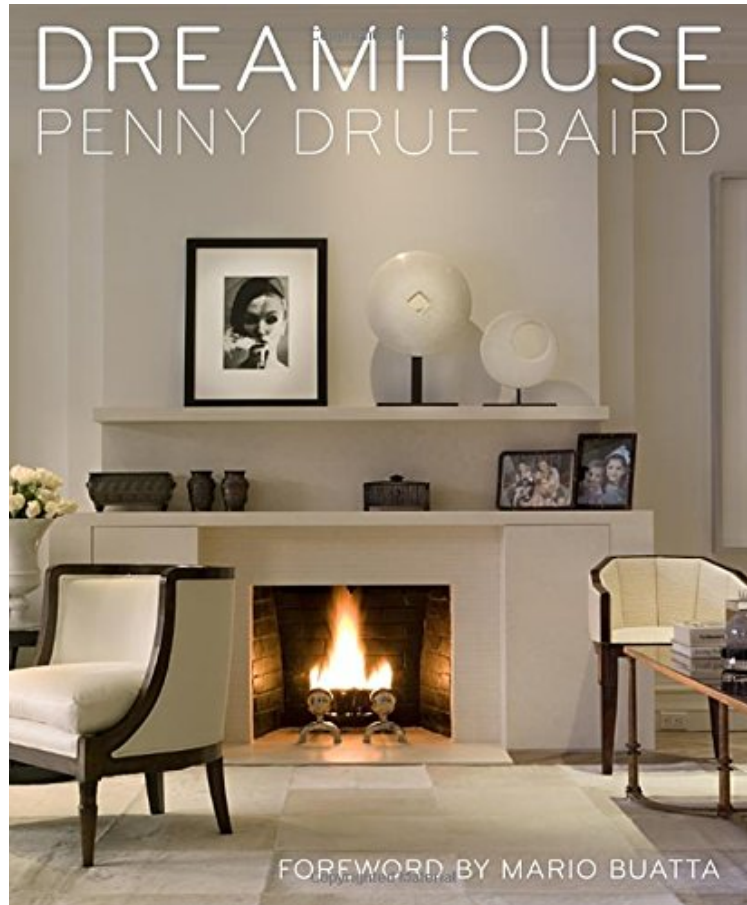

Keefer Every one deserves a dream house writes designer Penny Drue Baird in this book on design. And indeed that philosophy is reflected in the title of this book. Penny takes you through her geographically diverse and original rooms which she has designed with clients. A variety of style is represented depending on the area (Palm Desert or Paris?), the taste of the clients, and the architecture of the home itself. Penny narrates how she and the clients came up with the many design decisions in rooms. A blue antique rug inspired the color scheme in a Palm Desert room, for example. I've enjoyed seeing Penny's rooms in magazines, and now on Pinterest, throughout the years. In perusing these rooms you notice the attention to detail Penny which employs in the design whether it's a recycled French parquet floor or an antique lamp. Two of my favorite details are a Hermes scarf painted on the ceiling of a bathroom and white boards applied in various direction on the walls and ceilings of a small room with gray trim painted on. It seems many of the clients have the means and taste to buy quality

items. Some are collectors. But you can translate some of the style ideas to fit a more modest budget. In looking at the diverse rooms, you can't tell they were designed by the same decorator because Penny doesn't have a "look" which she imprints on every room she designs. Her design is definitely original - the Hermes scarf ceiling is brilliant. It seems she is inspired by the spaces and the clients' dreams. Penny may have come by her originality through her parents. She said when all of her parents' friends were decorating their homes 'faux French' in replication of the French taste coming out of the Jackie Kennedy White House (decorated by Jansen in part), Penny's parents home went for a more Spanish style with elements which would still be in vogue today says Penny. Design aficionados who enjoy reading about the thought process of a designer will enjoy seeing these rooms. My only suggestion for improvement would be to enlarge some of the photos so they would be full page. There was more white space than needed on some of the pages and more of the rooms we can see, the better. My favorite homes were the French apartment and the barn. Whether it's being inspired by COMPLETELY AFFORDABLE IDEAS of creating a beautiful stencil on a hard wood floor, ingenious designs for storage within any room, lighting ideas, etc., if YOU love to create a beautiful home for yourself, family and friends, you can absolutely use this book as a wonderful "idea source" and pick impressive designs within your budget. The pages are THICK...so thick that I often thought that two or more pages were 'stuck together'; only looking at the page number assured me that 2-3 pages weren't stuck together. I own several interior books like this one but what makes THIS book different from the other's I own, is that Penny incorporated a vast selection of styles from Paris Chic, Suburban Splendor, Uptown Cool and my absolute FAVOURITE interior: a magnificently rustic renovated barn in Bucks County. I was deeply inspired by the repurposing of the original barn's siding for the kitchen cabinets and a wicked cool banister of welded together old farm tools/equipment. Perhaps it's because I was raised on a farm and see the sad decline and elimination of such an American icon that this look was my favourite interior.
