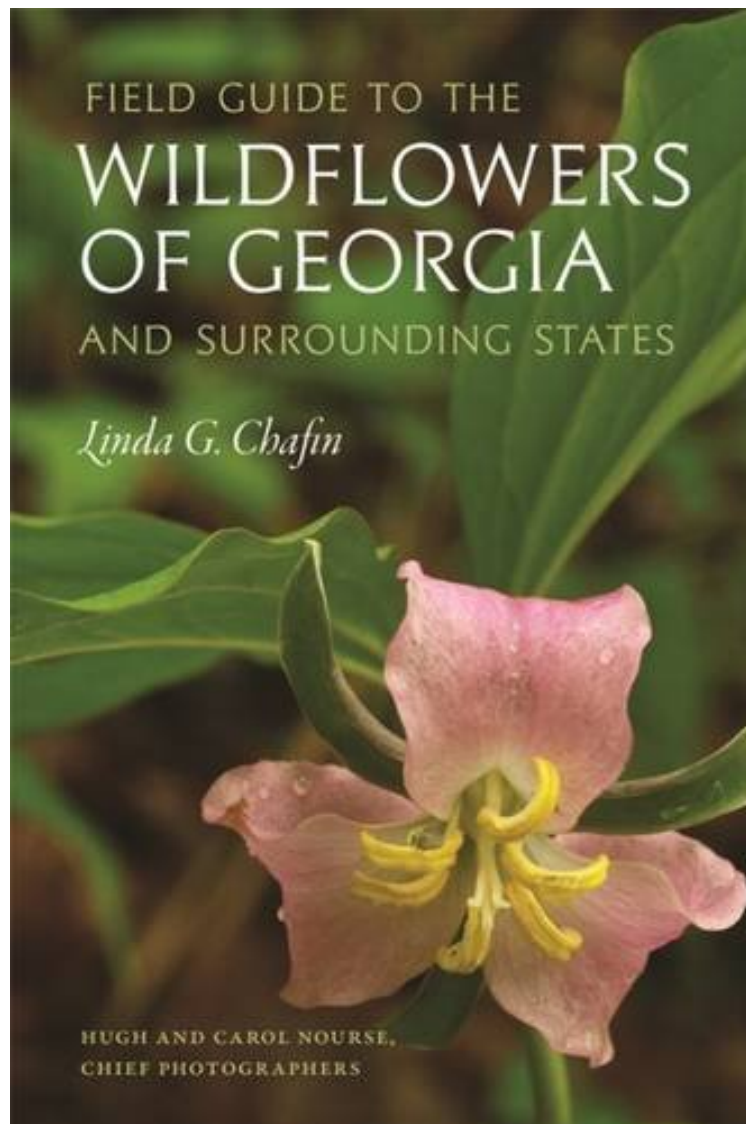

The color-coded index at the back is very helpful, and the individual listings for the flowers gives plenty of information. The one "complaint" I have is that not EVERY flower is in the color-coded index. There were several flowers I ran across in my hiking that were not in the color-coded index. I had to flip through the book page by page until I stumbled across it. That's not hard to do, but it does take a little time. I think it would have been helpful to include all of the flowers in the color index.
