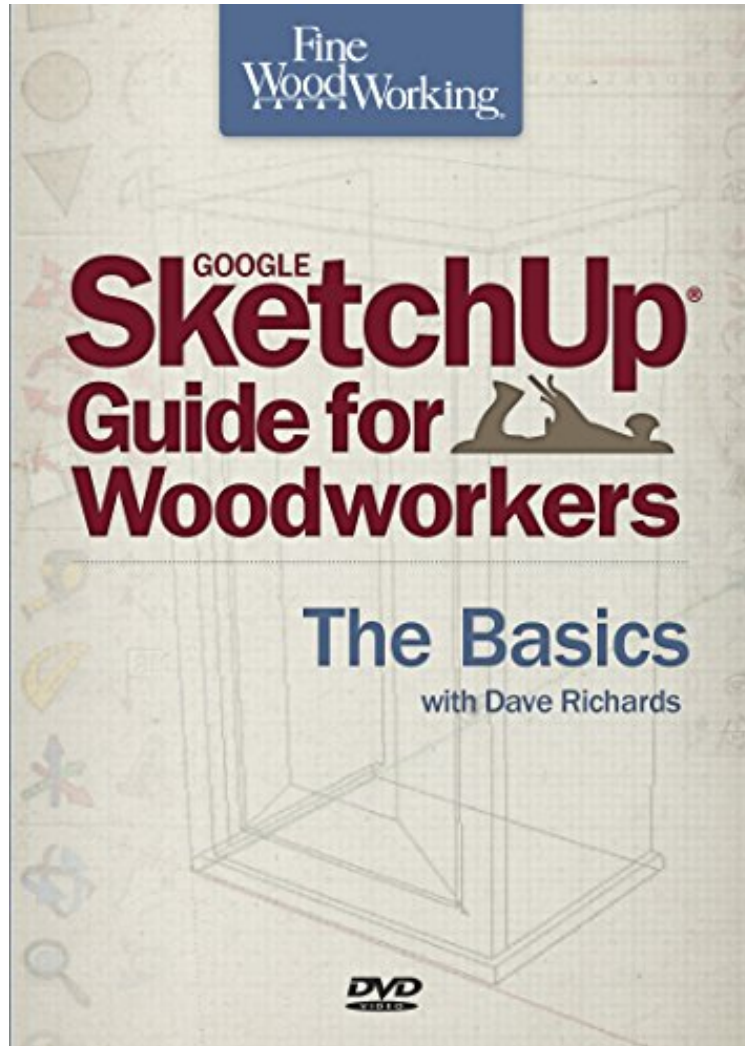

As other reviewers have said, it has the advantage of teaching with a woodworking project, rather than with the house construction the Google free tutorial uses. I did find the Google introductory tutorial better for learning basic tool movement, particularly the orbit/pan/zoom movements with a mouse with scroll wheel. However, once Mr. Richards got into specific steps of a preliminary sketch for a cabinet, the shortcut tips were very nice. Suggestions for a future revision: a) provide a printable copy of shortcuts to place next to keyboard. b) Teach step-by-step with the student having a blank copy of Sketchup open, and following each step. Overall, this is a great program for me, now approximately 10 hours past the raw beginner moment.
