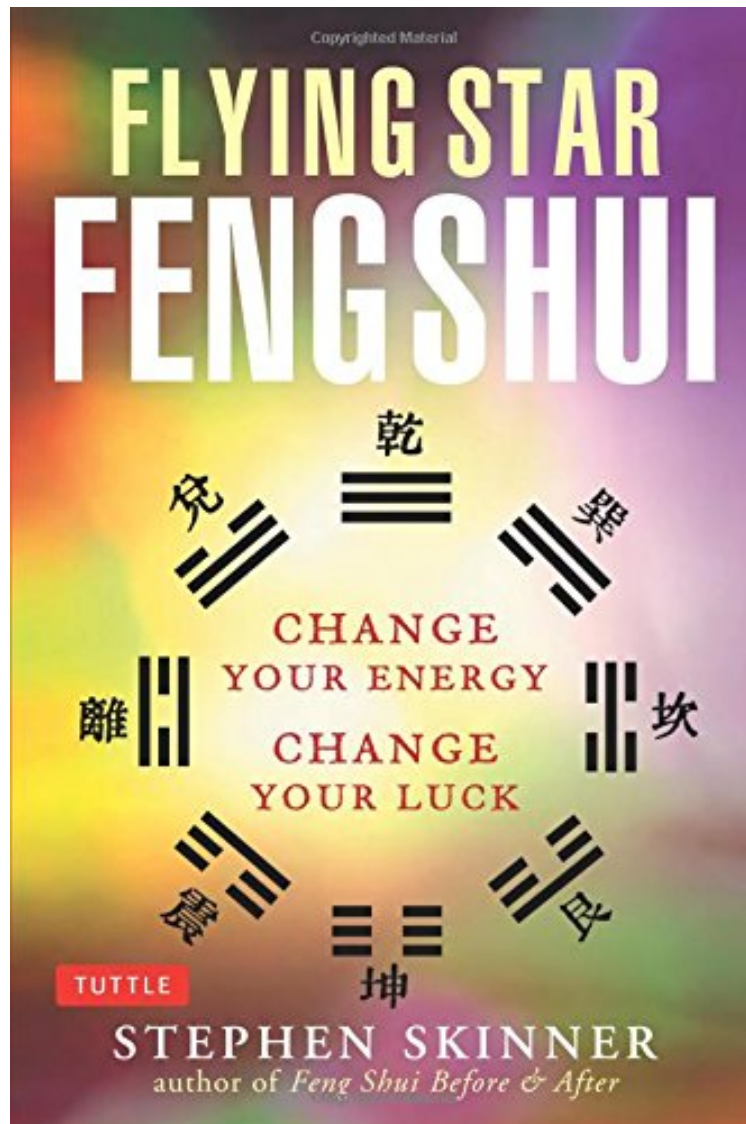

It has many culturally foreign concepts and views (if you are Westerner) in addition to the learning curve of taking on a new area of study.So far I would recommend this.
