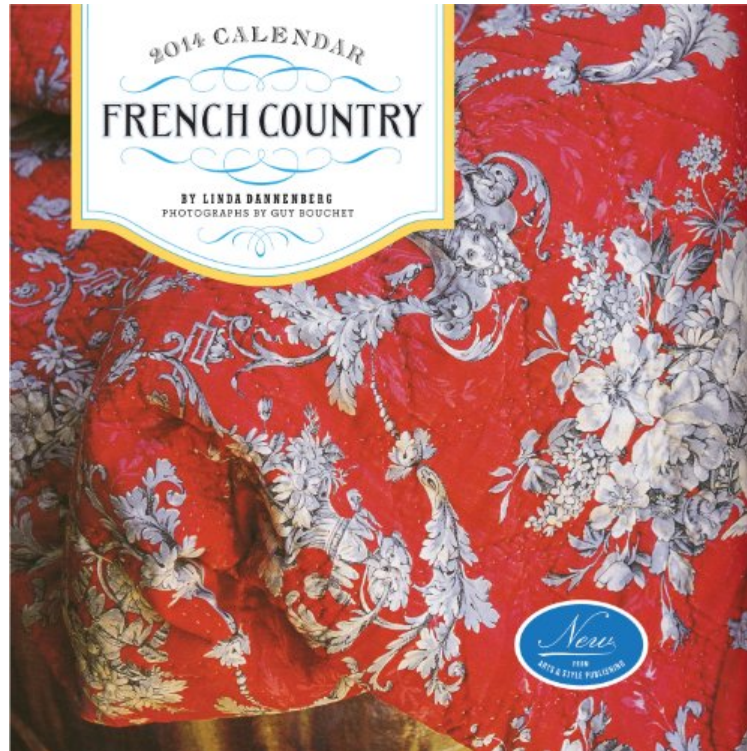

The photos are vibrant, some showing beautiful interior decor while others capture some of those unexpected moments you come upon while traveling in France, like the romantic light of sunset over Saint-Paul-de-Vence, or a fishing port on the Riviera with houses painted in the colors of a Matisse.

Exceptionally designed and masterfully photographed, this wall calendar will add a brilliant touch of French country style to any home or office, portraying not just vistas and exterior images, but the distinctive interior dcors and portraits of unique French style that have made the companion French Country Diary so successful and cherished. Each of the 12 exquisite calendar photographs by Guy Bouchet offers an intimate vignette of the French countryside, including interiors of inspiring country homes, lush gardens, picturesque villages, and inspiring landscapes.
