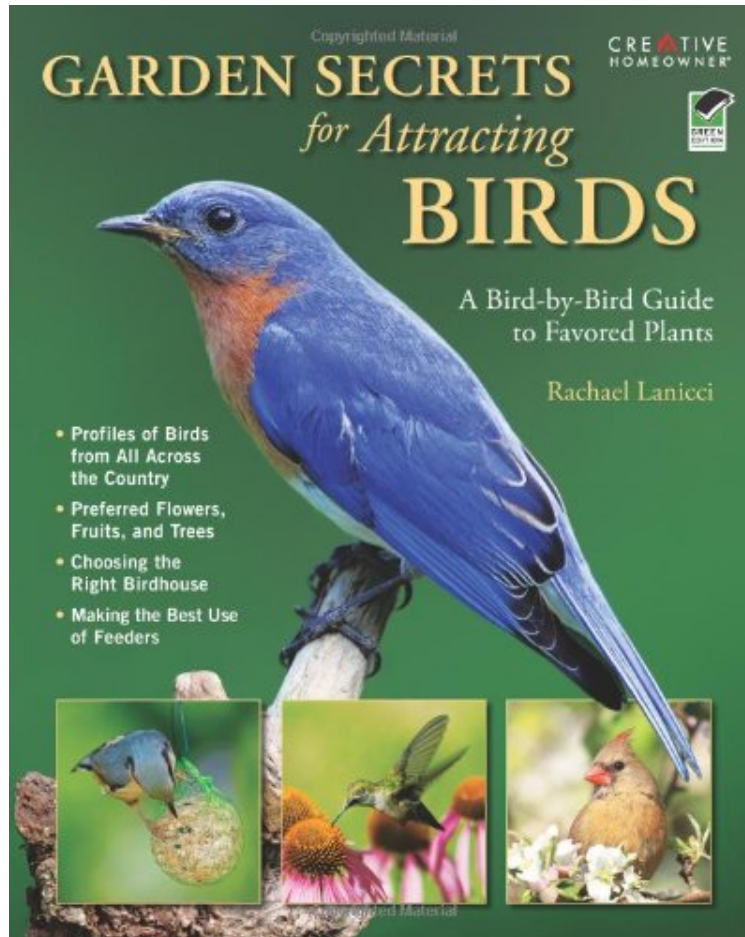

It has potential, however, it has two serious flaws: 1) I would expect a book like this to recommend native plants rather than the Asian species. It also recommends some invasive plant species like barberry. 2) If you are writing a book about birds, be sure that the photos match the species. I guess I should have known this before I bought the book since the bird in the lower left of the cover is a Eurasian Nuthatch - not found in the US. This bird also re-appears in the White-breasted Nuthatch section. Bohemian Waxwings appear in several places labeled as Cedar Waxwings - these are two different species! A bonus flaw is that

the House Finch on the Sunflower has an eye disease - photos of healthy birds would be better.
