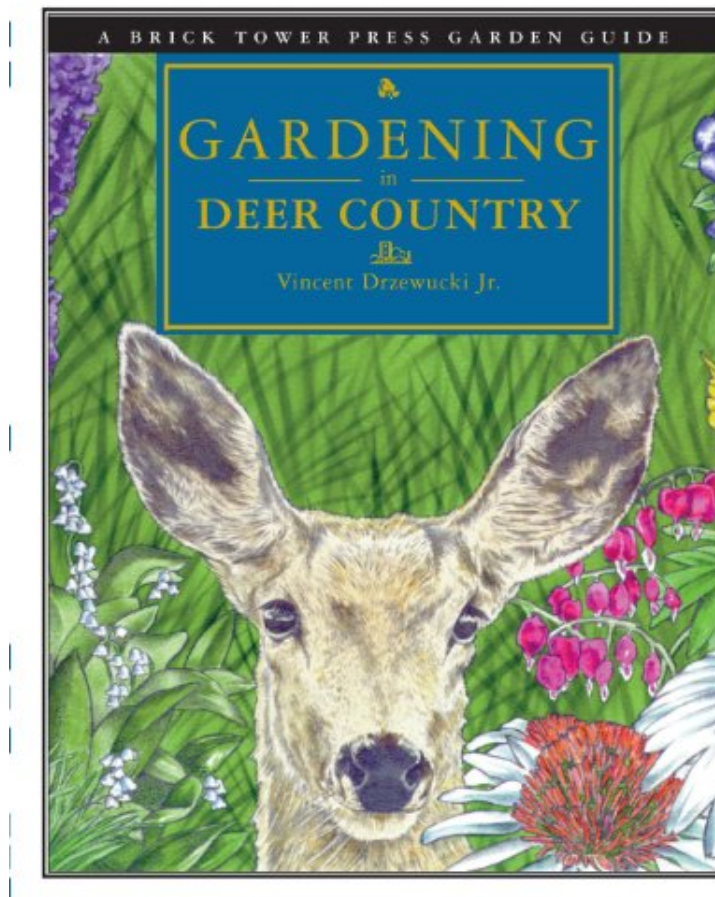

It barely reviews the basic and familiar methods we all have been spending our money on with little or no success. The majority of the book becomes a cumbersome list of plants deer tend mostly to dislike. One section letter grades these plants to varying degrees of deer avoidance. I wonder how many deer actually participated in that survey? The plant list could have been more helpful if not mere line drawings of the profiled selections. No color pictures of these plants are included to

help those of us not qualified as master gardeners. It even suggests methodical replacement of your established plants with the listed ones. That sounds like quitting to me!
